SUPPORTING WITH SCHOOL WORK



Your role in children's attainment at school.

Time and time again, research has shown that parental response to school and school work is one of the greatest indicators of a child's academic success. How you speak to your child about learning impacts their chances of achieving their potential.

How can you support your child best?

- Put importance on doing well at school, especially on the effort a child puts into their learning, not just the finished grade or piece of work.
- Ask your child about their learning and how it fits in with what they already know.
- Communicate with school about your child's learning, showing a united front with staff – don't speak badly about staff or learning in front of your child.
- Help your child to complete homework, support them to take responsibility for getting it done on time.



Task initiation at school.

The more important learning is shown to be to your child, the more likely they will be able to start their work efficiently at school and do a great job. This is because one of the greatest reasons that we start tasks is because we know they are important.
