What is a responsible citizen?

A responsible citizen is someone who we all would like our children to grow to be. Someone who abides by the rule of law, looks out for others and achieves their potential in their adult life. They do this by being an active member in their community and developing a strong sense of self-worth and empathy for others.

What are the children learning in school?

Children in Early Years (Nursery and Reception) – how to be kind and create a kind environment for everyone.

Children in Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2) – how to be polite and use manners.

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 and 4) – understanding how to be a responsible citizen focusing on respecting and helping others in their community.

Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 and 6) – being a responsible citizen in school so that everyone can learn without disruption.
